First Printing 2003

Page 19

Second to last bullet on page, line 2:

(for example, across an entire, unshaped shoulder), then bind off the second piece on a right-side row also.

Last bullet on page:

The complete phrase should read:

If the first piece ended with many stitches bound off on a right-side row (for example, across an entire, unshaped shoulder), then bind off the second piece on a right-side row also.

Page 137

Left column, mid-way, 2nd Right neck and shoulder (in bold) should be:

Left neck and shoulder.

Page 148

Remove chart fragment from bottom of page.

Page 158

After the bullets, second paragraph, last line should read:

. . . you need to work another swatch on smaller needles.

In the third paragraph, last line should read:

. . . you need to work another swatch on larger needles.

Page 169

Change first bold header from Lengthening a garment to:

Lengthening a stockinette stitch garment.
and under it:

Step 3, change Steps 4-4 to Step 4.

Step 4, replace text with:

Work Steps 5-7 of Shortening a garment, knitting all right-side rows and purling all wrong-side rows.

Middle margin note, first line change While you cannot to:

When you cannot.

Right column, V-neck shaping, Row 5 should read as follows:

Work 3 x 1 rib to 2 sts before marker, etc...

First Printing 2003, Second Printing 2003, Third Printing 2003, Fourth Printing 2004

Missing paragraph after STITCHES TO STITCHES:

Stitches-to-stitches

Here's a stitch-to-stitch seam in stockinette stitch. (You might notice that these edges curl up toward the right side of the fabric. Even so, these seaming instructions are identical to those for garter stitch, which lies flat.)

Page 54

Bottom of vitals last bullet should read 4.5mm/US7.

Page 137

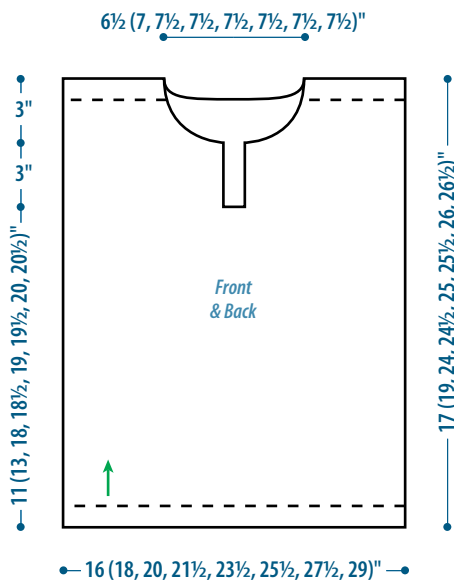
BACK top line should read:

16 1/2 (18 1/2, 23 1/2, 24, 24 1/2, 25, 25 1/2, 26)

The Vitals, Length B should read:

B 17 (19, 24, 24 1/2, 25, 25 1/2, 26, 26 1/2)"

End of second paragraph

Add the following:

The version on page 81 has increases worked in the body of the garment, the version on page 78 has them worked at the edge. The later is simpler and is how the pattern is written.
